

Proposed Charter
of the
GREEK COMMUNITY CENTER

ARTICLE I

Section 1: The name of this corporation shall be "GREEK COMMUNITY CENTER".

Section 2: It is to be located in the City of Daytona Beach, Volusia County, State of Florida.

ARTICLE II

The general nature of the object of this corporation is "to acquire, build, provide, possess, own, operate and maintain a place and center where persons of Greek nationality and ancestry may meet, assemble together and use for religious exercises, ceremonies, instruction and devotions; for social intercourse; for the education and instruction of their children; for the entertainment and accommodation of members of the corporation, their friends and guests; and for such other purposes as shall be determined from time to time by the officers and members of the corporation.

ARTICLE III

The membership of this corporation shall consist of all persons of Greek nationality or ancestry interested in the objects of this corporation, who have paid an initial membership fee of ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLARS each and an annual membership fee of TWENTY-FIVE (\$25.00) DOLLARS. Qualified persons may be admitted to membership in this corporation by agreeing to be bound by the By-Laws rules and regulations of the corporation, as required by the corporation, and the payment of said initial membership fee and annual membership fee.

ARTICLE IV

This corporation shall exist perpetually as provided by law.

ARTICLE VI

The affairs of this corporation are to be managed by a Board of Directors of seven (7) members, of whom one shall be President, one shall be Vice-President, one shall be Secretary and one shall be Treasurer, as elected and designated by the Board. Members of this Board of Directors shall be elected annually at a meeting of the members to be held hereafter on the first Tuesday in August at the corporation center; provided, however, that the first election of officers of the corporation shall be held on the first Tuesday in October, 1945, at a place to be selected by the Board of Directors of the corporation named in this charter to serve until such first election.

ARTICLE VII

ARTICLE VIII

The By-Laws of the corporation are to be made, altered or rescinded by a majority of the members of the corporation present at a regular meeting of the corporation duly called and held in accordance with the By-Laws of the corporation.

ARTICLES IX

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which the corporation may at any time subject itself shall be FIFTY THOUSAND (\$50,000.00) DOLLARS; provided, however, that such indebtedness shall never be greater than two-thirds (2/3rds) of the value of the property of the corporation.

ARTICLES X

The corporation may hold real estate in the value of not more than ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS, subject, always, to the approval of the Judges of this Court.
